A Body Hast Thou Prepared Me.

Wherefore when he cometh into the world, he saith, Sacrifice and offering thou wouldest not, but a body hast thou prepared me:

Us human beings are fearful of many things, we concern ourselves over many things, but I would venture that one of the greater of these is Loneliness. Your body has been stolen by this person, and this person has used it and lived in it for all these years, and has caused YOU, yes YOU, the real YOU to become lonely.

So take it back, claim your inheritance, and press your claim, that which is rightfully yours. Unless YOU and your body are re-united, you can never BE One. I speak to YOU, and YOU alone. Take back that which is rightfully yours, for I Myself have prepared it for you.
