

## CHRISTIANITY FROM MY PERSPECTIVE...

It has occurred to me that my use of the term "Christianity" may be offensive to some. Usually when mentioning Christianity, it's not in what some would think of as positive. Christianity is a huge network of organizea churches. The church as she was designed to be is not an organization but and organism, something living and vibrant and spontaneous. The idea was that there would eventually be many of these living churches in different cities, and they would be like stepping stones for the return of the Christ energy to this earth. They were to be the light of the Christ in each city where they were located, one church in each city and no more. Each city was to have its own local administration, and it would govern itself. No other locality would assume authority over any other locality.

These principles are found in the New Testament and they are never violated throughout the entire bible. All religion, not only Christianity, sees God as separate from man. That is a disempowering concept. The revelation of Jesus Christ was that he and the Father were one. Until I have seen that I am one with God, many doors remain closed that would open to reveal things that eye has not seen, nor ear heard.

What made the man Jesus what he was what he saw in his spirit. I often heard the term "The revelation of Christ" and it was always with the assumption that if you have the revelation of who Christ was then this made you strong in spiritual terms. Actually we do need the revelation of Jesus Christ but the one we need is not so much concerning whom he was, but what he saw. We need in other words the revelation he had that made him the man he was.

He came into this world apparently as an old soul for the purpose of giving humanity a jump start in terms of truth. He saw a far greater truth then he was able to teach unless he taught far more then we have record of. That is a good possibility. The point here is, that I need the revelation of Jesus Christ but that is the revelation he saw. This revelation is not so much about him but what he was able to see. Getting back to Christianity...
