

“If You Are Willing...”

A man that wanted to be healed said the foregoing words to Jesus... Jesus’ response was, *“Of course I’m willing.”*

Hidden away in the Bible are three passages that can change our lives NOW... TODAY!

“Jesus Christ is the same, yesterday, today and forever.” –Hebrews 13:8

Grasping the significance of this first passage can change us from having a religious and historical view of who Jesus was, including a worker of healing miracles some two thousand years ago... to *being* a miracle NOW... TODAY! In other words, the one that lived “back then” is willing to do the same things *today*.

This brings us to the second passage:

“The secret, the mystery of the ages, is Jesus Christ in you.” –Colossians 1:27

A religious view, no matter how valid, of who Jesus Christ is/was can rob us of the potential Jesus said was in anyone who believed in him. Understanding the *where* of Jesus Christ is vital to understanding what Jesus said we will be if we *believe* in the sense that he was using the word “believe.” Jesus was not talking about intellectually acquiescing to his pre-existence (prior to becoming a man), he was talking about doing what he said we will do if we get beyond our religious understanding about who and what Jesus Christ is. What did he say was the destiny of ANYONE if we enter into the realm of belief he was talking about? Here’s the third passage:

“Anyone that believes in me will do the very same works you have seen me do.” –John 14:12

Missed by the religious is HOW Jesus did the works... and how we can do the very same works. Are we ready? JESUS DID **NOT** DO THE WORKS! That’s right, Jesus said, “The Father in me does the works.” Those of us that live in the miraculous don’t do anything. The Father in us does the works. That Father is no respecter of persons, the Bible declares. In other words, what the Father does through me, He will do through you.

It has nothing to do with being “good” in the sense the religious use the term. In fact, focusing on human goodness is a deterrent to the process of getting to the point of doing what Jesus said ANYONE can and will do. Jesus said, “Why do you call me good? No man is good... only God is good.” Got it?
